THIS WEEK'S LESSON: ESAU



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Many times, Jacob had treated his brother Esau cruelly. He was a thorn in his brother's side. When the time came for them to reunite, Jacob was afraid. But Esau embraced his brother, choosing to forgive the wrongs of the past. Genesis 32:6-21, 33:1-4, Jacob Meets Esau



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

This week, when there's a disagreement in the house, remind your child of today's message and remind them that forgiveness can help them and the other person feel better.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What did Jacob take from Esau that made him mad?
- Why do you think Esau forgave Jacob?
- How can forgiving someone help us to feel better?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." Ephesians 4:32 (NIV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

There is no healing in revenge, but there is in forgiveness. Is there someone you've been resisting forgiving? Do it this week, and ask God to bring healing to that situation.
