PRAYERTIME

THIS IS YOUR DAILY SCRIPTURE:

The Lord is good and upright; therefore he shows sinners the way. He leads the humble in what is right and teaches them his way (Ps. 25:8-9).

THIS IS YOUR DAILY PRAYER:

Lord, You are good and upright. You show sinners Your way, which I am one. Lord, You lead those that are humble in what is right and teach them Your ways. Lord, reveal to me now what is right and show me Your ways.



PARENT PRE-READING: Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud; instead, associate with the humble. Do not be wise in your own estimation (Rom. 12:16).

CONVERSATION STARTER: I was reading in Romans 12 and it talks about living in harmony with one another. What can we do when we find that we are not in harmony with one another?



STARTING QUESTIONS

Is there someone in your school, teams, or activities that other students seem to bully? Why does this happen? What is your response?

READ THIS TOGETHER Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility consider others as more important than yourselves (Phil 2:3).

SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

What do you believe this passage is saying when it says, "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit"? Is this easy or difficult for you?

Why do you think God would want us to see others as more important than ourselves?

How might it hurt how we see others if our view of ourselves is damaged? For example, should we see ourselves as dumb or ugly? How would this affect the way we treat others?
