

LESSON 29 | Let's Share Jesus with the world

Bible Basis: Acts 9; 16; Revelation 1

Bible Verse: Revelation 1:7: "Look! He is coming with the clouds! Every eye will see him."

Bible Point: Paul told the world about Jesus. I can tell people about Jesus too.

How to use This Page

This week, you can read the stories listed above in *The Beginner's Bible* several times to help your child remember them. Use the Table Talk questions below to start a discussion around the dinner table, while driving in the car, or just about anywhere. The Living Faith activity is designed as a drama to help your child remember the Bible lesson. The Extra Mile provides interactive ways for your child to connect with the story.

TABLE TALK

1. Why was Paul mean to the Christians? (He didn't believe in Jesus or follow him.)
2. When Paul talked with Jesus, how did he change? (He believed that Jesus was the Son of God. Paul became a Christian and began to tell the story of Jesus.)
3. How did Paul tell the world about Jesus? (He traveled far and wide, by foot and by boat. He told the people that Jesus came to save them. God did many miracles through Paul.)
4. When is Jesus coming back to earth? (He is coming soon, but only God knows when it will be.)

LIVING FAITH

Have your child select one of the Bible stories from this week and act it out as you read the story aloud from *The Beginner's Bible*. Provide your child with props to help reenact the story of Paul's

conversion. Use a mask to pretend Saul can't see, and then take it off when he regains his sight.

When you come to the place(s) in the story where a Bible character speaks, instruct your child what to say. If possible, have your child perform the Bible drama for other family members via Skype, video camera, or in person.

EXTRA MILE

- You can make Scripture memory work more interesting by varying the way you and your child recite the verses they are working on. Try using different voices, such as a giant's voice or a mouse's voice. You can also recite the verses quietly, loudly, slowly, or quickly. It is important for your child to enjoy this time with you rather than feel as if it is a chore.
- This week, your child learned the importance of telling the story of Jesus to others. Encourage your child to tell the story of Jesus with friends and family members. Your child might find this easier to do when it is placed in the context of playing preacher.
