Week 1: Show Me

The good news is that God delivers on His promises. God is patient even when we are not. Often, when people are running they are feeling impatient. This week, let's talk about how God's love shows up.



THIS IS YOUR DAILY SCRIPTURE:

The Lord does not delay his promise, as some understand delay, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish but all to come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9).

THIS IS YOUR DAILY PRAYER:

Lord, You never delay Your promise. Help me understand Your timing. You are so patient with me and my family. You don't want anyone to perish but You are calling all to repentance. Here are some things that I need to repent of now



PARENT PRE-READING: The one who conceals his sins will not prosper, but whoever confesses and renounces them will find mercy (Prov. 28:13).

CONVERSATION STARTER: I was reading in Proverbs 28 and it says that those who confess and renounce their sins will find mercy. What do you think it looks like to really renounce our sins?



STARTING QUESTIONS

When do you think I have really shown you that I love you?

READ THIS TOGETHER Romans 8:35-39

SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

What do you believe these verses are telling us about God's love?

Why do you believe that some people question the love of God when they face hardship or difficulty?

What should be our response if we feel that we have done something or something has happened in our lives that makes us question His love?



FORGIVING FAMILY

Often, when our children mess up we react to the situation. This may not always come out the way we want to and things are said in the moment that we may later regret. One of the best times to talk about how to handle conflict that may arise in our families is when things are good and calm. Take some time and have a conversation with your kid about the best ways to respond when they have failed. Let them know that you see they are getting older and are building trust. Let them know your expectations, but also let them hear your love and desire that they come to you if they ever get in trouble.
