Week 3: Celebrate Redemption

The return journey should be celebrated. The word redemption is one of the most powerful words in the church. From the story of the prodigal son we see inside the life of a family and we see the celebration of redemption as a son returns home.

PRAYER TIME

THIS IS YOUR DAILY SCRIPTURE:

Be on your guard. If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him. And if he sins against you seven times in a day, and comes back to you seven times, saying, "I repent," you must forgive him (Luke 17:3-4).

THIS IS YOUR DAILY PRAYER:

Lord, help me be on guard. Show me if my family is sinning against You and may I be faithful and strong to rebuke them in love. God, I pray that myself and they would always repent. Teach us all to forgive each other over and over again. These are some things I know I need to forgive right now

Why do you believe the father would celebrate the return of his son? What can this teach us about our relationship with God?

What can we learn from this story about being a strong family?

ACTIVITY TIME

FIVE WORDS

One of the reasons people may run from God when they fail is because they are not grounded in the truth of who God sees them as. They also fail to realize the overwhelming grace and mercy of God. Take some time and find five truths that God's Word says about how He sees His Children. Write these truths on index cards and give them to your child each day for five days straight.
