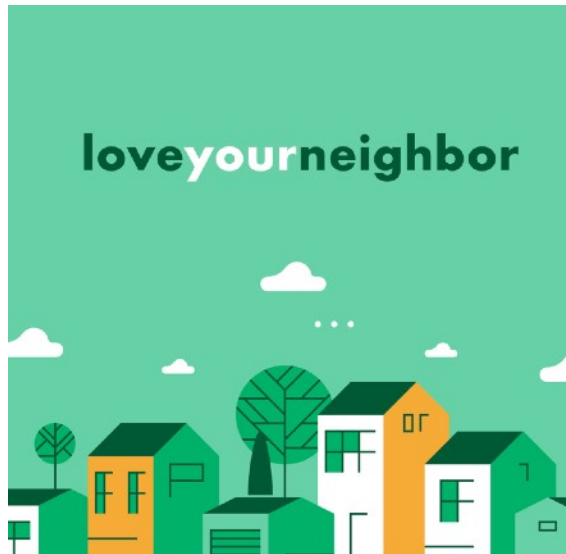

Week 1: Ask The Right Question

The story of the Good Samaritan starts with a question. The teachers of the law wanted to know how to inherit eternal life and have a good life. How to be right and good. What Jesus gave them as an answer was probably far different from what they had intended when they asked their question. This week let's ask some really good questions about what God wants from us.

PRAYER TIME

THIS IS YOUR DAILY SCRIPTURE:

Therefore, as God's chosen ones, holy and dearly loved, put on compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another if anyone has a grievance against another. Just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you are also to forgive (Col. 3:12-13).

THIS IS YOUR DAILY PRAYER:

God, You have chosen me. You have made me holy and You love me. Lord help me cover myself with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. These are areas of my life in which this is difficult _____. Lord, may my family bear with one another and forgive one another if anyone has a grievance against another. Remind us of Your forgiveness so we can always forgive.
