SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

If we call ourselves followers of Jesus, why is it so important that we would treat those that are hurting the way He would?

Who is someone you know personally that you need to show more love and compassion toward? Is this easy or difficult for you? What sacrifice might you have to make to love them like Christ has loved you?
