


## **WEEKLY PLAN**



### Week 3: Servant

Jesus is the best example of humility. When we think about God and His majesty and then realize that He humbled himself to the position of a servant, it should cause us to examine our attitudes. God has called us to serve the world in the same way He did. This servant mindset is both freeing and fulfilling to us as believers.

## PRAYERTIME

#### THIS IS YOUR DAILY SCRIPTURE:

Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, praise, exalt, and glorify the King of the heavens, because all his works are true and his ways are just. He is able to humble those who walk in pride (Dan. 4:37).

#### THIS IS YOUR DAILY PRAYER:

I praise, exalt, and glorify You the King of the heavens, because all Your works are true and Your ways are just. You are able to humble me and my family if we walk in pride.



**PARENT PRE-READING:** But he gives greater grace. Therefore he says: God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble (James 4:6).

**CONVERSATION STARTER**: I was reading in James 4 and it says that God resists the proud. Do you think God resisting the proud might actually be loving to that person? How so?



#### STARTING QUESTIONS

Tell us about a time when you served someone. How did you feel during and after this time?

**READ THIS TOGETHER** You are not to be called instructors either, because you have one Instructor, the Messiah. The greatest among you will be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted (Matt. 21:10-12).

#### SCRIPTURAL APPLICATION QUESTIONS

How has Jesus shown us what it means to be a servant?

The passage says, "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled." What do you think this means? Have you seen this to be true?

What are some simple ways that we could do a better job of serving one another as a family?
